Overview

Dental Nurses are a high priority within the Dental Care Professionals (DCP) group. This is a growth occupation area due to the increased numbers of dentists and dental therapists.

The primary role of the dental nurse is to support the dentist and other members of the dental team in patient care.

In addition to the support role a dental nurse's range of duties can include patient care, pre- and post-operative decontamination of dental instruments and the surgery environment, and non-clinical duties such as patient education and participation in clinical and practice management issues.

Dental nurses, after appropriate training can now also take and process x-rays.¹

Starting salary (once qualified) ranges from £15,000 - £17,000.

What is an Apprenticeship

An Apprenticeship is a mix of real work and learning. Apprentices earn a wage and get experience whilst working towards a number of qualifications. An Apprenticeship follows a Level 2 programme and can lead onto an Advanced Apprenticeship which is a Level 3 programme.

Example Job Roles as an Apprentice

- Dental Nurse
- Dental Therapists and Hygienists
- Oral Health Promotion Team
- Dental Practice Management
- Working within related Healthcare roles such as Nursing and Radiography

Apprenticeship Framework

There are a number of elements to each Apprenticeship and this is called the framework. Each Apprenticeship framework has three main strands:

- competence based element
- technical element
- skills element

The three strands are sometimes accompanied by additional qualifications to give the most relevant skills and knowledge required for the job.
